Legislation Authored and Enacted (1983-2006)

**House Bill 2627**

An act providing for the payment of death benefits to the surviving spouse or children of firefighters, ambulance service or rescue squad members, law enforcement officers or National Guard members killed in the performance of their duties, further providing for retroactivity of death benefit eligibility.

Became Act 89 of 2006

**House Bill 529**

(By amendment to SB 300)

Amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P. L. 6, No. 2), entitled "An act relating to tax reform and State taxation by codifying and enumerating certain subjects of taxation and imposing taxes thereon; providing for tax credits is amended by adding a subsection to read: Notwithstanding any other provision of this subsection, any income attributable to a distribution from a qualified tuition plan shall not be includable as income for purposes of this act to the extent that the distribution consists of providing a benefit to the distribute which, if paid for by the distribute, would constitute payment of a qualified higher education expense.

Became Act 67 of 2006

**House Resolution 695**

A Resolution directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a performance audit of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission including: a comparison of Pennsylvania to other states in terms of electric, gas, telephone and water costs to consumers; a comparison of Pennsylvania to other states in terms of budget, staff and funding sources of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; identification of important utility issues by the commissioners of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, members of the Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee of the Senate, members of the Consumer Affairs Committee of the House of Representatives, the Consumer Advocate, the Small Business Advocate, utility associations and consumer groups; a review of performance audits of similar agencies in other states to identify issues that may be relevant to public utilities in Pennsylvania; and that the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee report its findings, together with recommendations for legislation or other appropriate action, to the House of Representatives within seven months of the passage of this resolution.

Adopted, April 5, 2006 (196-0)

**House Resolution 351**

A Resolution establishing a Select Committee to investigate and review the policies, procedures and practices in place by the various Commonwealth agencies, authorities, boards, commissions, councils, departments and offices and the entities they license or regulate to protect the personal health, financial and other sensitive data of the citizens of this Commonwealth. RESOLVED, That the Select Committee hold hearings, take testimony and make its investigation at such places as it deems necessary in this Commonwealth; and be it further RESOLVED, that if the Select Committee determines that testimony it is about to receive is of a confidential nature or would disclose practices which, if made public, may compromise security measures already in place or which may be put in place in the future, the Select Committee be permitted to close the hearing to the public; and be it further RESOLVED, that the Select Committee submit a report of its findings and recommendations for any legislation or other action to the House of Representatives.

Adopted July 1, 2005 (198-0)

**House Bill 1031**

Abolishing terminal and travel sabbatical leaves for teachers in public schools and placing requirements on educational sabbaticals to enhance teaching skills.

Became Act 66 of 1996

**House Bill 2**

Amending the Public Welfare Law providing for a workfare program, for eligibility for assistance, prohibiting duplicative payments, for medical assistance vouchers, felony welfare exclusions, electronic benefits transfers, parental responsibility, and economic independence for recipients.

Became Act 20 of 1995

**House Bill 1153/House Bill 1154**

(By amendment HB 1341/HB 1392)

Amending the Public Welfare Code by eliminating the transitionally needy category of general assistance which provided cash grants each month for up to three months and year-round medical coverage for over 40,000 able-bodied adults, ages 18 to 45; establishing, implementing and administering job-training programs for welfare recipients.

Became Act 49 of 1994

**House Bill 2332**

(By amendment to HB 675)

Amending the Volunteer Firemen's Relief Association Act to enable volunteer firefighters to utilize relief association funding for exercise and fitness equipment.

Became Act 78 of 1993

**House Bill 1196**

(By language inserted in SB 727)

Committee of Conference report signed into law

Amending the Public Employee Relations Act providing for fact-finding in the event of a school strike.

Became Act 88 of 1992

**House Bill 2220**

(By amendment to SB 903)

Authorizing and directing the Department of General Services to release land in Westtown Township, Chester County from certain restrictive limitations.

Became Act 58 of 1988

**House Bill 1405**

(By amendment to SB 1304)

Providing for an increased negligence standard and Good Samaritan liability protection to volunteers and non-profit organizations involved in public service including volunteer fire, ambulance, religious, charitable, fraternal, veteran, civic, county fair or agricultural associations and their auxiliaries offering public service programs.

Became Act 179 of 1988

**House Bill 1435**

(By amendment to SB 1286)

Providing disabled veterans whose service records are certified by the service unit of the armed forces with whom the veterans served shall be entitled to a disabled veteran's plate.

Became Act 166 of 1986

**House Bill 1625**

Providing additional Good Samaritan liability protection against civil damages and lawsuits to volunteers, uncompensated managers, instructors, coaches, umpires, referees, and assistants who conduct, sponsor or participate in organized youth sports programs and to all such programs operated for the physically handicapped or mentally challenged, regardless of age.

Became Act 57 of 1986

**House Bill 336**

(By amendment to SB 300)

Requiring the Department of Transportation to provide a clear, concise explanation of the penalties contained in Pennsylvania's drunk driving law and further providing that the Department of Transportation enclose such a brochure with each new driver's license and learner's permit mailed or at the time of issuance of a photo driver's license.

Became Act 12 of 1984

**House Bill 958**

(By amendment to SB 713)

Allowing local municipalities greater flexibility in allocating foreign fire insurance tax revenues which go to volunteer firemen's relief associations.

Became Act 205 of 1984

**House Bill 2368**

Authorizing the Department of General Service to convey 30 acres of land to Westtown Township and 10 acres of land to Gaudenzia, Inc, a non-profit corporation that operates the Gaudenzia House rehabilitation treatment center in Westtown Township, Chester County.

Became Act 233 of 1984
